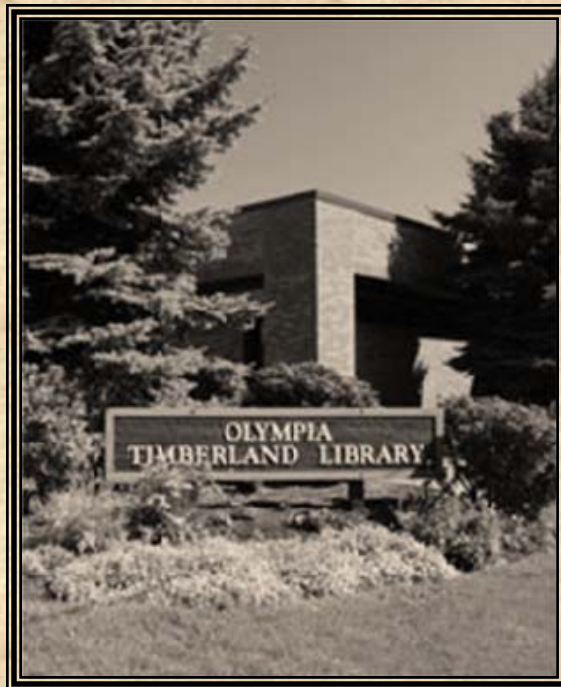

Editor's Note: The following story is a good example of what information might be found in the Civil War Pension Files.

UNCLE CALEB HAD A WANDERING FOOT

Caleb Wells Turner was born June 22, 1834, the first child of Abraham and Mary Ann (Slawson) Turner to be born at their final home in Spring Brook, Lackawanna (then Luzerne) County, Pennsylvania. His three older brothers and two older sisters had been born either in Orange County, New York or in the Horseheads area of Chemung County, NY. (A younger sister and younger brother, my Great-grandfather, were born in Spring Brook later.)

By 1850 Caleb as a 16 year-old was listed in the Census as "Laborer" living with his widowed mother, older brothers Nathan and William, and younger brother Loren. His father Abraham had died in a drowning accident in 1844, his mother had sold the Spring Brook farm, but they were all still in the Covington Township area of Luzerne County.

Sometime in the 1850's Caleb decided to make his fortune in the West, and moved to New Cassel, Auburn Township, Fond du Lac County in southeastern Wisconsin. There he married his first wife on January 8, 1860, (listed as "L. Jane Scott" in his pension record but "Sara" in the 1870 census.) Their first son, Loren, was born shortly after.

On September 30, 1861, he took the railroad a few miles south to West Bend, Washington County, Wisconsin, and enrolled in the 12th Regiment, Wisconsin Volunteers of the Union Army, Civil War. He didn't see much service, as he was given a medical discharge for "epilepsia" on March 27, 1862, at Leavenworth, Kansas. (The epilepsy apparently didn't shorten his life any, as he lived on for more than 45 years.)

Returning from service, he fathered three daughters Emma, Nellie, and Ella between 1862 and 1869. By the time of the 1870 Census the family was living in Plover, Portage County, central Wisconsin, where Caleb lists his occupation as farmer.

In 1873, his wife died in Auburn Township, Fond du Lac County. Maybe they had moved back there? His four children have sunk without trace, as I cannot locate them in later U.S. or Canadian census records. Maybe they died young of the epidemic diseases of the time; maybe they went to live with their mother's relatives?

On January 19, 1878, using the name "Wells Turner" he married widow Lucy (Mitchell) Gammon of Strawberry Point, Clayton County, Iowa. This is just across the Mississippi River from the southwestern corner of Wisconsin. He and Lucy stayed on (her farm?), and Caleb AKA Wells Turner was listed in the 1880 census again as "Farmer".

In 1885, Caleb and Lucy were living in Paynesville, Stearns County Minnesota, where Lucy lived the rest of her life. Eight years after this marriage, in October 1886, he deserted Lucy. One of the pension affidavits states that "I have been going from place to place and state to state selling books, maps and spectacles."

From Neillsville, Clark County, Wisconsin in 1888 he filed his first "Declaration for Original Invalid Pension", which required that his disabilities were service-related. The Surgeon-General's Office replied that there was no record of a hospitalization or disability while in service. He tried again in 1890 when the requirements for a pension were relaxed. This time he submitted character references from his relatives in Cedar County, Iowa attesting that he was "totally disabled and unable to do any labor either manual or mental." The appointed doctor recorded that he was partially disabled with lung trouble, hernia, and loss of two fingers on his left hand. He was finally approved for an Invalid pension of \$12 per month in 1892.

Around that time he stayed with his brother-in-law Reverend Sam S. Scull in Rochester, Cedar County, Iowa, helping to care for the small children after Sam's first wife died. He used to visit Sam from time to time, but when Caleb got the urge to go he would simply walk out "without a fare-thee-well".

On April 18, 1894 Caleb, using his real name, married again unbeknownst to Lucy. His new wife was widow Eliza McDougal Enslow Jerome (but listed as Kauper or Kaufman on the license). She had been living in Clayton, Iowa for some time, running the village store/post office. That was near where Lucy had lived, so presumably Caleb first met her there. For their wedding, Caleb & Eliza crossed the Mississippi River to Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin. On the marriage license Caleb lists his occupation as "General agent of medical co.", which sounds like a salesman. They returned to Eliza's place in Clayton, Iowa— and then just eight months later begin the letters to the Bureau of Pensions.

Uncle Caleb continued

From Eliza: "To Commissioner of Pensions—

Please to tell me where you sent my husband's Caleb Wells Turner's pension to... Christmas morning he told me he was going to Bagley WI, 3 miles over from us. I asked him how long he would be gone. Said he did not know. He told the Ferryman that he would pay him when he came back. He staid 2 nights in Bagley & said he was going to Mt. Hope (WI). He did not go there... I am a cripple, lost my limb above my knee 14 years ago. I have to walk on crutches. I am left alone in the dead of winter. Oh, dear, I am in such trouble. Will you kindly answer & tell me where you sent his Pension to. Oh do! Yours with respect, Mrs. C.W. Turner"

Apparently after Caleb left Eliza, she found some old letters and connected with Lucy in Minnesota. Lucy writes to Eliza:

"Dear Absent Friend— I will try to answer your first and welcome letter. My health is very poor; hope you are well... I would like to see you very much. If you hear from Turner please let me know. I meant to track him down... To Mrs. Jerome /from a friend in ??? trouble, Mrs. Turner."

Eliza included that letter in her next letter to the Pension Bureau:

"To Commissioner of Pensions, Washington

Dear Sir— I beg leave to intrude upon you again. Last March I wrote you & asked you to give me the address of Caleb Wells Turner, which you kindly did... If you remember I told you that he married me April a year ago last April. Preached in our pulpit, had family prayers, got my money & skipped... Now will you be so kind again after he sends for his pension to let me have his address- Do! ... Yours with respect... Mrs. E.M. Jerome." (In another letter she states "I do not use his name")

Eliza's next letter tells more:

"To the Hon. Commissioner of Pensions.

Dr Sir— Do forgive me for troubling you again... hoping you can remember something of the history I gave you of the Rev. Caleb Wells Turner last March... Well, he had a living wife in New Paynesville Minn. He had forsook & had no bill [of divorce]... I had no knowledge of his wicked deeds, so help me. He would start into the mercantile business against my wishes, but after telling me that the first of July he would draw his money out of the bank, that he had plenty. If he should die he would leave me independent. I believed every word the Rev told me & got my money out of the bank & gave to him to pay for goods. He kept it or done something with it. He lived here with me in my home 8 & half months. Then gave a mortgage on all of our goods & then ran away. Now Do Please let me know where he is when you send his pension to him in April. [gives his name etc.]

Yours Respectfully, Mrs. E.M. Jerome"

Six months later on November 5, 1897 as "C. Wells Turner" Caleb marries a third widow. Now he's moved into Missouri, and in Merrellton, Franklin County, he weds Lockie Jane Bandy. If there's a name for someone who marries three widows in three states under three different names, would it be "trigamist"? But this time the outcome was different. Eliza reads a newspaper item and sends it to the Commissioner of Pensions:

"Dr Sir— Excuse me again for troubling you... Now I am going to send you a newspaper cutting [clipping] I received last Friday... It will show you what the Old Villian has been up to again... Now by this cutting I send you will see that he married again since he left me & tried to get all the Poor woman had. It is too bad to let such a villain run at large doing such damage & causing such distress... Cannot you write to the P[ost] M[aster] wherever he is & have him arrested.

Yours respectfully, One of Turner's victims, Mrs. E.M. Jerome"

Her next letter goes further:

"To the Hon Commissioner of Pensions--

Dear Sir— Do excuse me for troubling you again... I wrote you of his marrying again, then getting the woman's property in his own hands. The P.M. received a letter from me & also one from his sick wife up in Minn... They got after him & gave him his choice to make the poor woman's (Lockie) home back to her or be arrested. He gave up his hold on her property & skipped before daylight the next morning... I want to keep him from ruining the life of some other poor woman. Thanking you for your kindness.

Yours truly, Mrs. E. M. Jerome"

Uncle Caleb continued —

About 1898 a law was passed allowing deserted wives to claim half of the veteran's pension. First, each veteran was sent a simple questionnaire asking, if he was married, for the maiden name of his wife and date & place of marriage. Caleb plays it smart, by giving the name of his FIRST (presumably dead) wife:

Are you married? If so, please state wife's full name:

L. Jane Scott

Married at: **Fond dulac Wis. Jan. 8th, 1860 by J.J. Daggs?**

What record of marriage exists? **In office County Clerk, Fond du Lac Wis.**

From here on, Lucy is doing everything she can to claim a share of his pension. (Eliza realized early on that she didn't want the money, she just wanted him arrested for bigamy.) Lucy submits her marriage record from Strawberry Point, Clayton County, Iowa; then a "Declaration of Wife Under Act of March 3, 1899" :

... **Lucy S. Turner**, aged **57** years, a resident of **New Paynesville**, County of **Stearns**, State of **Minnesota**... makes the following declaration in order to obtain one-half of the pension due or to become due her husband **Caleb W. Turner**... and who **deserted deponent in September 1886 and deponent has not seen him since, nor has the soldier... since Sept. 1886 in any way contributed with support of**

deponent. That her said husband served as a **private** in **Co. D, 12th Regt. Wisconsin Vol. Inf.**... That she was married under the name of **Lucy S. Mitchell** to said **Caleb W. Turner** at **Strawberry Point, Clayton Co., Iowa**, on the **19th day of January, 1878**... that she had **not** been previously married; that the **soldier** had been previously married. **That the first wife of said Turner died in Sheboygan**

County, Wisconsin, many years before date of marriage of deponent.

Now the Bureau of Pensions sends a form letter to Caleb at Mint, MO:

"Relative to your above cited claim, you are hereby notified that **Lucy S. Turner, New Paynesville, Minn.** did on **Sept. 13/99** file an application to have one-half of your pension paid to her... on the ground that you **have deserted her for a period of six months or more**. Thirty days will be allowed you to file such evidence... This letter should be attached to and filed with your reply."

And so begins the next chapter in Uncle Caleb's shenanigans. He decides that if Lucy wants half of his pension, he'll see that she gets half of nothing. He manages that by letting his checks go unclaimed for three years, at which point the Bureau of Pensions figures out that he's either dead or no longer needs the money.

Lucy, of course, doesn't realize this. She writes to Eliza:

"Dear closest friend—I will try to answer your welcome letter that I received a few days ago... Since I got your letter I got one from the Pension Agent at Washington with a Circular to be filled out. He wants to know so many things. I have got to prove when Turner first wife died and where. I know nothing of his wife, only he told me she was dead, that she died in Wisconsin... I would be so glad if I could get a part of that pension but there is a good deal to it before we get it. The lawyer here is doing all he can for me... He said he would assist me all he could free of charge...

From Mrs. Lucy Turner to Mrs. E. M. Jerome."

Caleb is hiding out in central Missouri. When the 1900 Census enumerator comes around Montgomery Township in Hickory County he's using the name "Chester Wells." (I wonder how many other aliases he's had?)

For some reason the Bureau of Pensions asks Lucy to file another "Declaration of Wife..." including "evidence of desertion, good moral character & necessitous circumstances." But she makes a bad mistake when she states:

That she was married under the name of **Lucy S. Gammon** to said **Caleb W. Turner** at **Strawberry Point, Iowa**, on the **19th day of January, 1878**... that she had been previously married...

The Bureau of Pensions notices the discrepancy in her names, and asks for clarification:

"Referring to your claim... your attention is invited to the fact that in the declaration filed September 13, 1899 you allege that you were married... under the name of Lucy S. Mitchell, and that you had not been previously married; while in declaration filed May 10, 1902, you state that you were married... under the name of Lucy S. Gammon and that you had been previously married... You should explain this discrepancy... and file a transcript from the proper public record showing your marriage as alleged... The fact and date of the death of your former husband and of the soldier's former wife should be shown by a transcript from the public records... Your statements as to the desertion of the pensioner should be corroborated by the testimony of reliable and disinterested witnesses... The evidence herein called for should be filed within thirty days."

Uncle Caleb continued

Lucy replies:

“To Commissioner of Pension, Washington DC— Your letter Aug. 5 received. There is a mistake in the statement of my marriage with Caleb Wells Turner as Lucy S. Mitchell. It is wrong. My maiden name was Miss Lucy S. Mitchell. I was married to Caleb Wells Turner under the name of Mrs. Lucy S. Gammon, widow, that I had been previously married. This is correct...”

The Bureau of Pensions then follows up:

from Chief, Law Division, Bureau of Pensions to Chief of the Special Examination Division: “Herewith are transmitted the papers in the claim... of Lucy S. Turner for half the pension granted Caleb W. Turner... which you are requested to forward to a special examiner whose territory embraces Stearns Co., Minnesota, for the purpose of a thorough investigation to determine— 1) Whether the claimant is the legal wife of pensioner, and the deaths of all former consorts; 2) Whether the claimant is a woman of good moral character; 3) Whether the claimant is in necessitous circumstances... 4) The exact date (day, month and year) of the alleged desertion... and 5) Whether the claimant or pensioner has ever applied for or obtained a divorce... It appears... that the pensioner has not been paid his pension since February 14, 1900, when his last known post-office address was Longlane, Dallas Co. Missouri... It is highly probable that the pensioner, on learning of claimant’s claim for half his pension, ceased to draw his pension fearing a charge of bigamy...”

The examiner (detective?) writes to several of Caleb’s former acquaintances all over central Missouri, and all reply that his whereabouts are now unknown. In early 1903 he writes back to his boss describing his lengthy investigation, inability to locate Caleb, and “What do I do now?”

Then a letter from Commissioner of Pensions to Lucy:

“You are hereby notified that your claim... for half the pension granted Caleb W. Turner... was on April 9, 1903 approved for rejection, on the ground that the pensioner having failed to claim this pension for 3 years, his name has been stricken from the list of pensioners... and claimant therefore has no status...”

That must have broken her heart.

Things were quiet for a few years while Caleb wandered around central Missouri. His final letter to nephew Sam S. Scull says he was working in Weaubleau, Hickory County, as cook for a college club group. Finally in 1907 Caleb decides that it’s safe to surface and re-claim his pension. His “Declaration of Pensioner for restoration to the rolls” from Iconium, St. Clair County, MO. states that he has not claimed his original pension due to “Circumstances beyond my control.” The medical examiner states “Senility well marked.” But the Commissioner of Pensions wanted more... Caleb then appeared and swore before a Notary Public in Cedar County MO:

“I ceased to draw my pension since Feby 4, 1900 on account of being informed by the Hon. Commissioner of Pensions... that a woman claiming to be my wife had applied for one half of my pension and calling on me to answer under oath whether or not she was my lawful wife, and not wanting to incur the scandal incident to such a contest I quietly withdrew and let the matter sort. At the time I ceased to draw my pension as aforesaid I could work and could get along without it. Now I am old, feeble, crippled up and can’t work.”

In early 1908 he was approved for restoration at \$8 per month from February 4, 1900 and \$12 from October 16, 1907. The Commissioner of Pensions still had Lucy’s claim on file, and sent her a notification:

“Referring to your former claim... for one-half the pension allowed Caleb W. Turner... which was rejected April 9, 1903 upon the ground that you had no title, the pensioner’s name having been dropped from the rolls..., you are advised that said pensioner’s claim has this day been approved for restoration to the pension rolls... If it is your desire to reopen your claim... you should execute the enclosed blank form of declaration”

But the letter was returned to sender “The person whose address this letter is sent died in the Town of Paynesville Oct. 3rd, 1907” So Lucy never got a cent.

That same year Caleb files another “Declaration for Pension” from Grant County, Wisconsin. (Finally he was tired of Missouri?)

Uncle Caleb continued

Apparently this was in connection with a new law increasing pensions for former soldiers now aged over 75.

“his occupation was **mason**; he was born **June 22, 1834** at **Luzerne County, Penna.**; his several places of residence since leaving the service... **13 years in Wis, 6 years in Iowa, 4 yrs in Minn, & balance the time till now in Missouri.**”

His application was approved in July 1909 for increase to \$20 per month. But he didn't live to enjoy it very long. On November 11, 1909 Caleb died in the poorhouse at Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, WI and was buried the next day in Evergreen Cemetery, Prairie du Chien without a tombstone. His death certificate states that he “Strayed into County Poorhouse [14 days earlier]; Nothing known of him, apparently about 70 years old.”

The U.S. Pension Agency closed their books on him in April 1910:

“I have the honor to report that the above-named pensioner... has been dropped because of DEATH, Nov. 11, 1908 at Prairie du Chien, Wis.”

Novice genealogists are warned about what skeletons they might discover in their family closets. My father once stated “There's never been a Turner sent to jail.” Maybe not, but if anyone deserved it, it would have been Uncle Caleb.

The publications mentioned are sent to our society in exchange for our Quarterly. They are filed alphabetically by state and county in the vertical files in the genealogical section of the Olympia Timberland Library. OGS no longer binds the genealogical periodicals they receive, but previously bound numbers are in storage at Montesano and the Timberland Service Center. Check at the Olympia Library Information desk for a list and ordering information.

Willamette Valley G S Fall 2009 Letters Home to Illinois should be helpful to anyone with ancestors who traveled by wagon train from Ill. to Oregon 1851-2. There are excerpts from Ill. newspapers and letters to Ill. about those who came to Or mainly to Marian Co. and info on members of Disciples of Christ in 1911.

Yakima Valley G S Dec 2009 Another long list of new books in their collection including those we donated from the Caroline Wright collection. Also a book review of "Ministerial Directory of the Presbyterian Church U S 1861-1941 which contains extensive biographical sketches of all Presbyterian Ministers in the South.

Seattle G S Autumn/Winter 2009/10. Good article on new and free databases from the Eastman online genealogical newsletter. The DAR library has spent years scanning and indexing their records, and they are now available to the public. Includes descendants of Revolutionary soldiers from member's applications, many genealogical records, their library catalog and many other resources.

Puget Sound G S Dec 2009 Informative article on how to find military personnel, missionaries and other Americans abroad. The author couldn't find her father in 1930 census. He was in the Navy on a ship. She corresponded with the census bureau and extended it to others abroad and got helpful information.

South King Co Jan/Feb 1010. You might be interested in the article Lost in Translation which discusses the problem of archaic words in your research, whether medical terms, occupations, tools and much more. Some helpful websites are listed and a list of Colonial occupations.

Gray's Harbor G S Jan/Mar 2010. Here is a list of Dollarhyde's 45 Genealogy rules. They are not only amusing but some too true! For instance: A cousin once removed may not return. Genealogy is an addiction with no cure and for which no 12-step policy is available. I'm crazy about genealogy but not necessarily yours. If you took a family group sheet to the last wedding you attended you probably are an addicted genealogist.

Chelan Valley G S Vol. 19 issue 4. Are you familiar with the home children of Canada? It is estimated that 100,000 children were brought from England to Canada between 1869 and 1920's and their descendants makeup 11 percent of Canada's current population. Not all were orphans, some were from poor families or had medical problems. Much information is in this article on how to access these records and could be helpful to Canadian researchers.

Oregon G S Quarterly Winter 2010. Two articles of interest to all. One is Exploring Genealogy Groups as a way to share our genealogy interests with others and Why Online Genealogy isn't Free.

Minnesota Genealogist Autumn 2009 A unique Minn. resource is the Alien Registration Records of 1918. These records hold data on people living in Minn. who hadn't received citizenship as of Feb. 1918. The article is lengthy and does tell how to access them.

Hoosier Connections Fall/Winter 2009. Good information on Indiana mental Institutions and mental health care. It was cited on the handout at the Jan. OGS Meeting and you can read it in the library.

Grant Co G S Dec 2009. I'm sure we've all visited Grand Coulee Dam Here is an extensive article with photos on the Columbia Basin Project and its effect on Grant Co.

Tama Co Iowa Jan 2010. Fascinating article about America's Parcel Post Services. It started in Jan. 1913 and grew quickly. Some very special parcels included a bank sent brick by brick and a 4-year-old girl mailed from Grangeville to Lewiston Id. She weighed 48 1/2 lbs just short of the 50 lb limit and traveled in the train's mail compartment to her grandparents for 53cents!

Kern Co Ca Sep 2009. Here is the tale of Nancy Kelsey who designed and made the Ca State flag which is still used today. It was made from unbleached muslin and a strip of red fabric from her petticoat. It was designed by William Todd, a nephew of Abraham Lincoln. She was also the first white woman to cross the Sierra Nevada Mountains into Ca. in 1841. Same Dec 2009. Informative article on using the U S census records by checking the neighbors with some good results.

Fiske Genealogical Foundation winter 2010 Cal. Digital newspaper Collection. U. of Cal Riverside is doing this project . The newspapers are from 1849-1911 and can be accessed by cdnc.ucr.edu/newsucr. The author tried it and found several hits new to him.

Oklahoma G S Vol 54 # 4 2009. Two short articles that should be of help to all. One is a listing of 23 clues that can be found in an obituary. Too bad all obits aren't this complete. The other is Latin abbreviations used in genealogy.

Northeast Wash. G S Jan 2010. A continuation of the timeline of Stevens Co from 1900-1906. A good project for someone to do on Thurston Co or some county you are researching.

Clallam Co G s Jan 2010. Interesting and extensive articles on Finding Ancestors on the Web especially using search engines.

Sno-Isle G S 4th quarter 2009. If you have trouble writing queries or getting responses, check out the article on Sounder Queries . Members of the society took a class and their queries were posted to Clark Co G S This issue lists the queries and the solutions suggested by the Clark Co researchers. Might give you some good ideas.

Toledo Area G Sc Ohio Dec 2009. An explanation of the land purchase process in the Colony of Penn. There were 5 steps— application, warrant to survey, survey, return of survey and patent— all of which are explained in detail.

Grays Harbor G S Dec 2009 Good article on family tree sites- one questions if they help identify thieves, and the other has a genealogy social networking quiz in which you match which genealogy related task goes with a social working site.
