Motion made and carried that Master appoint a committee of three to await upon county commissioners in regard to slashing and burning of new Bickle Road. Comm. Appointed Bros: Bennet, Chambers and P. Larsen.

Motion made and carried that sec'y request our Congressman to send the grange a few copies of Dept of Agriculture Year Books for year 1909.

Suggestions for the good of the order: Suggestion made by Master that Grange Bulletins be passed on to non-members when members are through with them.

Lecturer's Hour: Story telling contest; won by Sister O. I. Evans.

*The publications mentioned are sent to our society in exchange for our Quarterly. They are filed alphabetically by state and county in the vertical files in the genealogical section of the Olympia Timberland Library. Some of them are eventually bound and placed with bound periodicals in storage at the Montesano Library and Timberland Regional Library Service Center. Anything in storage can be ordered at the reference/information desk to be sent to your library for your use.*

**Oregon Genealogical Society** Fall 2010 - Helpful article on how to prevent overuse injuries when sitting at a computer for many hours. Tips on the chair you use, your desk, the monitor and mouse and giving your body a break.

**Grays Harbor County Genealogical Society** Oct-Dec 2010 - A good article on names, spelling & the census. You may think you've tried all the tricks but this comes up with some new approaches.

**Whitman County Genealogical Society** October 2010 - Did you know there are still about 120 sons & daughters of Civil War, Union and Confederate vets still living. Children of father's 2nd or 3rd marriages and very young mothers accounts for this.

**Texarkana USA** Spring and Summer 2010 - Excerpts from the Texarkana Gazette in 1898 are interesting, amusing and amazing as a picture of life in that time and place. Don't forget old newspapers as a genealogical source. Most have been microfilmed and available through your library on interlibrary loan.

**Milwaukee County Genealogical Society** November 2010—An article on ancestry.com explains the difference between a personal Ancestry subscription and Ancestry's Library edition which is available to all of us at our public library. This article may help you decide whether to subscribe and take advantage of the added databases.

**Minnesota Genealogical Society** Summer 2010—After the great program by Randi Moe, you may want to try using city directories as she did. Here is an article on filling family history gaps with city directories with how-to hints and examples. Also article on writing with flair and illustrating your history when you don't have family photographs. Many examples of alternate illustrations are given including census pages, places, cemeteries, buildings etc.

**Grays Harbor Genealogical Society** December 2010—Some really helpful articles in this issue i/e. resolving conflicting information clues in names and getting stumped in Zane's Trace, a saga of western migration.

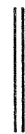
