ELIZABETH AYER,  
WASHINGTON'S FIRST WOMAN ARCHITECT

If you were to mix intelligence, determination, education, courage, single minded dedication and skill, you might have the components of an Elizabeth Ayer.

Born in Thurston county on a farm located on the banks of the Des Chutes River on October 13, 1897, Miss Ayer was youngest of five children born to Charles Henry Ayer and Cora Jane Ellis.

Elizabeth was descended from the Conner and Ellis families on her mother's side. These families were early day loggers. Her paternal grandfather came to the California gold fields in 1849, but returned to the East. We can only guess that his tales of the west encouraged his son to consider Washington Territory.

Charles Henry Ayer was a lawyer and an early Superior Court Judge. He died in 1898 when Elizabeth was not yet 5 months old. She stated that she learned early how to work side by side with the men because of her four older brothers. Her brother, John, was not quite 13 months older than Elizabeth.

Elizabeth's education started at Bush School, a one-room cabin on land once owned by pioneer George W. Bush. After graduating from Olympia High School in 1916, she went on to the University of Washington.

Miss Ayer had this to say about her choice of professions: "I had no ability to spell, so I couldn't be a stenographer, no patience, so I couldn't be a teacher, and no memory so I couldn't be a waitress. I had to be an architect!" This was her joking response to a question she had been asked many times. What really caused her to pursue her career in architecture, a field that had only male students, was a talent for math and an acquired interest in architecture once she was in college.

Architecture professors and male students did not make it easy for women. Clients swore they would never work with a woman architect. In addition, there were not woman's restrooms in the architecture building. By the time Miss Ayer graduated, she had won that battle and a ladies' restroom was put in the architecture building.

By graduation in 1920, there were other women enrolled in Architecture, but she was the first to graduate. Miss Ayer credits her successful career to excellent training, both in school and by her first employers. She became a member of the American Institute of Architects and that membership is noted on her headstone.

Elizabeth's first position was with Seattle architect Andrew C. P. Willetson, who was a student of Frank Lloyd Wright. Later she was with Edwin J. Ivey Architects in Seattle as an employee, then a partner and finally head of the firm.

Miss Ayer's study and work in New York (1922-23) as well as her travels in Europe (1927-28) led to her distinctive residential architectural style. This specialty appealed to her because she loved working with people in the way one must work when building a house for them. According to a 1978 article in the Olympian, more than 100 homes were standing in Seattle that she had designed. Her work was characterized by English lines and colonial details, such as small panes in the windows. On the next page I have some pictures of a local (Olympia) home that was designed by her.

Miss Ayer retired in 1970 to Panorama City and lived there for 17 years. She served on the Panorama City resident council and the Lacey Planning commission for 3 years. We have her to thank for Lacey maintaining College Street's natural setting, preventing another commercial street like Sleater-Kinney. She was a founding member of the Olympia Genealogical Society and was a member of the Washington Historical Society.

She was never married, saying, "I'm your typical old maid. It's difficult to be an architect and be married. It's not something you can do before marriage, then go back after the children are grown. There is too much change." This is a direct quote taken from her interview in 1978 by Jan Stewart of the Olympian.

Elizabeth Ayer died in Lacey on August 1, 1987 and is buried at the Masonic Memorial Park in Olympia.

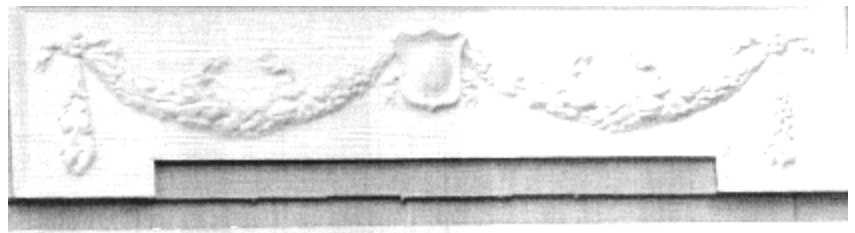

**Thurston County, Washington Marriage Packets – 1903**

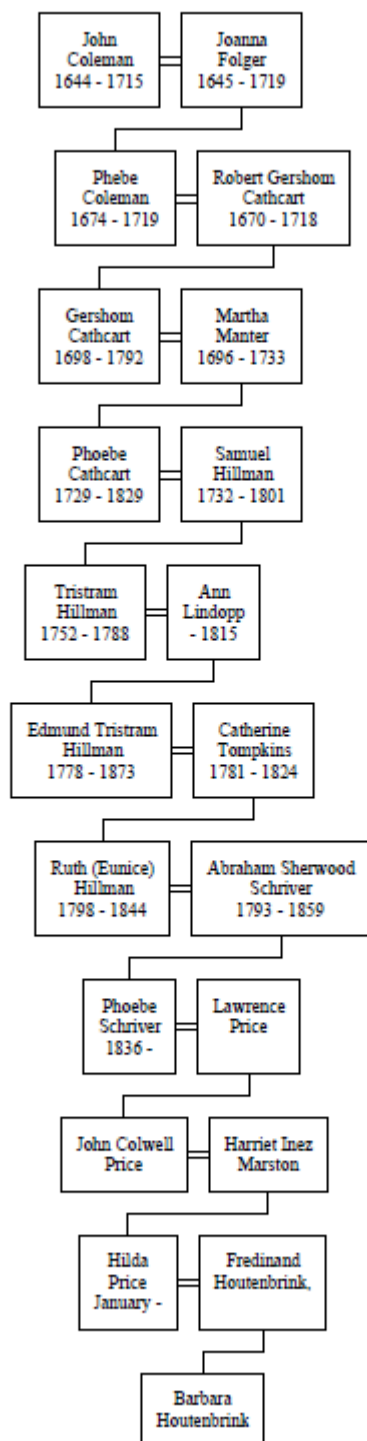

*The publications mentioned are sent to our society in exchange for our Quarterly. They are filed alphabetically by state and county in the vertical files in the genealogical section of the Olympia Timberland Library. Some of them are eventually bound and placed with bound periodicals in storage at the Montesano Library and Timberland Regional Library Service Center. Anything in storage can be ordered at the reference/information desk to be sent to your library for your use.*

Minnesota Genealogical Society, Spring 2011. Several helpful and interesting articles useful to all. One is an extensive article on writing about sensitive family history issues. What may seem harmless or even funny and exciting to us may be the opposite to a family member. Bringing a family photo back to life is based on Swedish American research and very illuminating on life in Sweden in early 1900s.

Same, Summer 2011. Real photo postcards in Minnesota and if you have Polish ancestors who passed through Minneapolis you will be interested in the Minneapolis Polish Church database project.

Mason County Genealogical Society, June 2011. Most of this issue is on reunions with many ideas to make yours successful and interesting.

Same April 2011 this issue has an article on gathering family stories and attending family gatherings.

Same May 2011. What to do about clutter and what is a search engine. As you can see, this publication has many short helpful articles for their members and other genealogists.

Many more similar tricks are listed.

Researcher Tacoma Pierce County, Summer 2011. Their annual issue is full of interesting stories of members' research. Some are about black sheep like the man who had 3 wives at same time, the wife who returned to England with her young son, crooked roots and murder. Also stories on residents of the area and research done on Kathryn Grayson and Ava Gardner, both born 1922 in North Carolina. Then there is an index to Pierce Co and Washington publications in Researcher 1969-2011.

Idaho Genealogical Society, Summer 2011. Stories on the Civil War both Confederate and Union and what it was like living in Idaho at that time.

Oklahoma Genealogical Society, Vol. 56, No. 2. 2011. The Society does look-ups if you have Oklahoma relatives or problems. Information on how to do this is included. Also, an invitation is given to Descendants of Early Settlers of Oklahoma, if your family was resident before 16 Nov 1907. Last is Yesterday's Ireland by Paddy Linehan, The author grew up in rural Ireland in the 1940s-1950s and recounts his life and that of earlier generations.
