Did your ancestor hear the cry of "Free Land"? The Homestead Act of 1862 was approved on May 20th 1862. Homestead National Monument of America is commemorating the 150th Anniversary of the Homestead Act of 1862. The Homestead Act was one of the most important events in the westward expansion of the United States. The Act granted 160 acres of free land to claimants for a filing fee of \$18. Only one of my six pioneers who went to Washington took advantage of the Homestead Act (1862), two others took Agricultural Land Scripts (1862), one took a Donation Land Claim (1850), another purchased his land under the Cash Entry Sale Act (1820), and another was a squatter and died before he could take legal rights to land under any act. There was many ways to get land on your way west.

I emigrated to the United States of America from LIVERPOOL ENGLAND on the vessel Friedland; my last foreign residence was Ryhope England

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to GEORGE V, KING OF GREAT BRITAIN & IRELAND, of which I am now a subject.


I arrived at the port of PHILADELPHIA, in the State of PENNSYLVANIA on or about the 17 day of MAY, anno Domini 1905; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein.

Walter Cullingford's petition for naturalization includes the information about his birth and arrival in the United States. It also lists all of his family members, their birth dates and places, and current residence. The petition was filed 16 January 1913 and gives his arrival as 17 May 1905.

The passenger list on the next page supports the family story that Walter and his son, Walter T., came to America before the rest of the family.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from **Liverpool England** on or about the **2** day of **May**

Fifth. I was admitted to the United States, at the port of **Philadelphia** on the **17** day of **May**

Sixth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the **19** day of **September** anno Domini **1905** at **Pittsburgh Pa.** in the **U.S. Circuit** Court of **Western District of Pa.**

Seventh. I am **married**. My wife's name is **Mary Cullingford** the one born **Tow Law England** and now resides at **Elizabeth**

Eighth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbeliefs in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and solely to **GEORGE V, KING OF GREAT BRITAIN & IRELAND**, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Ninth. I am able to speak the English language.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the **17** day of **May** anno Domini **1905** and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the **17** day of **May** anno Domini **1905** being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Eleventh. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Court of **Western District of Pa.** on the **19** day of **September** anno Domini **1905**, and the petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, **and the cause of each denial has since been cured or removed**) attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor, together with my affidavits and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses therein, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States.

Walter's wife, Mary E. Cullingford, arrived with the rest of the family on 16 October 1905. The SS Merion took 12 days to make the crossing from Liverpool. Included with the family is Rebecca, age 22, not listed in the 1901 English census. The Sunderland, Durham, registry office online database shows that Walter T. married Hannah R. Turner in 1905 before he left for the United States.

On the left side of the passenger list is the person (Walter) the family was meeting and where he lived. It also show that Rebecca was going to her husband, Walter T. Cullingford, at the same address in Elizabeth, Pennsylvania.
