David Hastings



David W. Hastings. David W. Hastings of Shelton died on January 2, 2013, at Mason General Hospital. He was 67. Dave was born to Warren and Fay (Hambleton) Hastings on December 11, 1945, in Vancouver, B.C. As a child he enjoyed living in a large house with his parents, grandparents, great-uncle, aunts and cousins, and singing "God Save the Queen" at school. When Dave was seven, he and his parents moved to Pasadena, California, and a very different environment. Dave was a member of the Vikings Car Club and raced an Oldsmobile at appalling speeds. He spent twelve years working as a grocery clerk at Don's Market on Rosemead Boulevard, while putting himself through Pasadena

High School, Pasadena City College and California State University at Los Angeles. In 1973, Dave moved to Bellingham where he earned a master's degree in history, met his future wife, Kathleen Waugh, and worked on Moore's Blueberry Farm. In 1976, Dave and Kathleen moved to Olympia and began working at the Washington State Archives. Dave inventoried the Archives' holdings, created its widely-respected research room, and for thirty-five years helped thousands of genealogists, lawyers, writers and other researchers delve into Washington State's historical records. Few people anywhere knew more about Washington State history and government than Dave. Dave is survived by his wife, Kathleen Waugh; his daughter, Rebecca Hastings of Shelton and Ellensburg; two sons, Ian Hastings of Shelton and Thomas Hastings of Perris, California; two aunts, Jean Fell of Kingston, Ontario, and Beverly Horne of Prince George, B.C.; and eight cousins.

Terry Joyce Huntley



Terri Joyce Huntley, a dedicated historian who helped Washington State's digital archives rise to national prominence, died in Olympia on March 19, 2013. Her sunny disposition will be long remembered. Terri fought a resolute eight-month battle with lung cancer. She was 54. Terri ("T.J." to friends) dropped out of high school at 16 and earned her GED at 21, a matter of great personal pride. She got hooked on history at Grays Harbor College in Aberdeen and went on to graduate from The Evergreen State College. Her diverse life experiences and commitment to excellence led to an award-winning career with the Office of Secretary of State. Terri managed the Historical Records Project, a volunteer program that transcribed and indexed 3.4 million records that are now accessible worldwide. Before joining the agency as an archives preservation specialist for Southwest Washington in 1998, Terri worked as a short-order cook, health trainer, Kmart

cashier, book store owner, administrative aide at KGY radio and lead caseworker for the Olympic Area Agency on Aging. As the Historical Records Project coordinator for the secretary of state, Terri drew on her decade of experience working with courthouse, city hall and library employees throughout Southwest Washington. "She served admirably and creatively, recruiting and managing hundreds of volunteers who transcribed thousands of documents to be placed in the Digital Archives," Secretary of State Kim Wyman said. "In addition, Terri was an enthusiastic volunteer for many events and activities that supported our whole agency. People still talk about the fun 'Wayne's World' music video she produced for the Combined Fund Drive talent show." "Wayne's World" italicized Terri's love of music and her infectious sense of humor. Her life was punctuated with caring and sharing, according to family, friends and co-workers. She directed drama at Montesano High School; wrote oral histories for family members; videotaped the Olympia toy run and donated the profits to the cause. She was a bell ringer for the Salvation Army and contributed to the Humane Society. In all, Terri produced, videotaped, and edited some 50 videos for Thurston Community Television and was a member of its board of directors. Her work for TCTV included a history of the Odd Fellows Lodge; the Cowlitz Trail project; the story of Tenino's wooden money and a profile of Bronco Tesia, proprietor of the legendary Liberty Saloon in South Aberdeen. "She loved live theater," Mike Huntley, her husband, recalls. Flower Drum Song, The Rocky Horror Picture Show and Mamma Mia! were among her favorites. Likewise live concerts from Alice in Chains, Black Sabbath and The Who to Tom Jones, Paul McCartney, Willie Nelson and Frankie Valli. "Terri was a rocker chick at heart," Mike adds "but she loved to play music from the '20s, '30s and '40s on her clarinet," and she knew the words to every Golden Oldies song. KBRD was her favorite radio station. She and Mike would sing along as they cruised to the Tacoma swap meet in their vintage Studebaker sports coupe. During her 15-year career with the Office of Secretary of State, Terri was certified in every aspect of archival preservation, from repairing books and documents to digitizing records. She was trained in grant-writing for preservation projects and was a skilled ombudsman. She compiled oral histories on notable public figures in Grays Harbor history and wrote a college paper on the unsolved 1940 Laura Law murder case. Sam Cagle, a retired Air Force colonel, worked with Terri for four years, gathering and digitizing military records. "Always pleasant, always upbeat, she was able to guide and motivate those 150 volunteers in her care," Cagle recalls. "A special friend, a tireless mentor. She will be missed." Terri was born on Oct. 31, 1958, at Tacoma General Hospital. She was raised by her mother Joyce and her stepfather Roger Nelson. Terri grew up in Western Washington, mostly in Olympia, Puyallup, and Tacoma. She and her first husband, Rod Zimmerman, had two children, Jacob Jay and Jenell Marie "Jake" and "Nellie." The family lived in Olympia, Lilliwaup, Randle and Centralia. Terri and her second husband, Scott Barbour, lived in Aberdeen and Montesano. That marriage also ended in divorce, as did a marriage to Sasha Juillerat. Terri endured a parent's worst heartbreak in the fall of 2000 when Nellie died of Huntington's disease after a nine-year battle they fought together. To work through the grieving process, Terri wrote a book "Losing Nellie: A Mother's Journey of Loss." It was her hope that through her words, others would be able to understand that they are not alone. Terri often said that when her daughter died it was like Nellie truly became a part of her. She always felt her presence. Terri and the love of her life, Mike Huntley, were married in April 2009. Terri cherished her family and friends, her dogs (Jack and Violet), movies, garage sales, cruising in the Studebaker, Halloween (her birthday), shopping and Cannon Beach, Ore. Terri's zest for life, her love of music and standup comedy, were summed up in her favorite saying: "Laughter makes a crying heart dance." In her last weeks of life, Mike recalls, she wrote that on the whiteboard in their den. In addition to her daughter, Terri was preceded in death by her brother, David Nelson, and grandparents Eldin and Ethel Fain. In addition to her husband, she is survived by her son, Jake Zimmerman, and granddaughter, Megan Zimmerman; by her mother and stepfather, Joyce and Roger Nelson; three sisters, Lori McBride, Julie Nelson and Deni Nelson, and a brother, Dan Curley. In lieu of flowers, the family encourages donations to the Salvation Army in Olympia. A celebration of Terri's life is set for 2 - 5 p.m. Saturday, April 6, 2013, at the Olympia [Elks Lodge](#), 1818 4th Avenue.

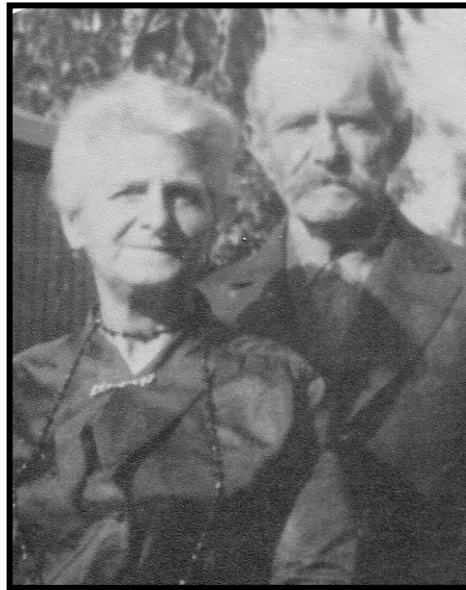

Discoveries In Time

With patience and perseverance comes great satisfaction.

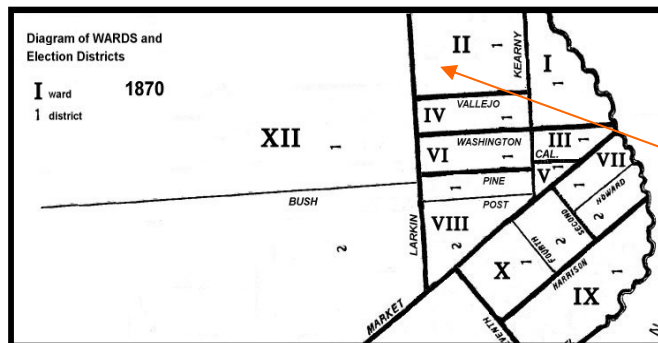
A tale of her great grandparents.

I grew up on my Grandmother's folklore tales about our French family ancestors but as I developed my genealogical talents, my discovery of facts sometimes challenged the versions of the stories I held onto from my childhood. One story was about my Grandmother's parents – my great grandparents, John Baptist Alphonse and Eugenie Alexandria Guinde (pronounced like Grand but without the 'r'). Eugenie was a first generation Californian; she was the daughter of French immigrants that had come into California at San Francisco in 1850. Eugenie was born in the Gold Rush Country at Mokelumne Hill in 1854. The city was a magnet for French speaking people among its 20,000 inhabitants in the 1850s.

They only stayed a few years and then the family moved back to San Francisco. So by 1860, I found them there listed in the Federal Census as the ‘Grand’ family and Eugenie is 5. In the 1870 census she is 15 and has her own laundry business. It is in the robust City by the Bay where a very handsome young man arrived in his uniform and swept Eugenie off of her feet at the age of 15, and they were married after her 16th birthday in September 1870. According to my Grandmother, John Baptist was the storybook “dashing officer on a white horse, dressed in a French uniform” and was “drop dead handsome”.



In June of 1870 when the census was taken, the Guinde family were living in Ward 2 in San Francisco. Second Ward—Bounded by Kearny Street on the east, Vallejo Street on the south, Larkin Street on the west, and the Bay of San Francisco on the north.*

The background story for John Baptist Alphonse is that he was a French Army conscript from Marseille, France. He was among the 38,000 troops of the French Expeditionary Force sent by Napoleon III to Mexico in support of Ferdinand Maximilian Joseph, known simply as Maximilian, who had accepted the offer of the Mexican throne. In April 1865, the French Army successfully pushed the Mexican forces led by Juarez almost into Texas. Family stories relate, John Baptist was wounded and was secretly cared for by a Mexican family. In the meantime, the French sailed for home and he was left behind. When he had recovered, he headed for New Orleans considering it French territory but had second thoughts and headed for California. Although my Grandmother’s tale said he was an officer, it appears a commission was an embellishment. Still, Eugenie was undoubtedly infatuated by the French uniform!

How that sounded so romantic to me in my teenage years! My mother had fallen in love with a Navy officer during WWII and he was tall and blond and ‘oh, so, good looking’ that she was engaged after two weeks and married two weeks after that. And I could certainly agree that my father was every bit deserving of his description.

But how handsome Eugenie’s John Baptist was, I could only guess. There was a charming picture of John Baptist and Eugenie near their 50th wedding anniversary that appears at the beginning of this story. They were sweet little white-headed people and I would concede that he was a cute old man with a big mustache - but “drop dead handsome?” My teenage heart did not flutter. And no one had any pictures of the couple in their younger years to alter my mind set.

When I began my genealogy I couldn’t find a trace of them in the 1880 Federal Census. How could they be missing? Only recently when Ancestry.com added more “sounds like” options did they finally appear. My delving located not an Alphonse family but an Elphonse family in Jamestown, Tuolumne County, California, in 1880. All of the four children were the right age and I was delighted that I had found what was lost! There was John Baptist and his wife “Jennie”, a nickname for Eugenie. My Grandmother is listed at three years old, along with the three other sisters. I was surprised to read John Baptist’s occupation was listed as a barber.

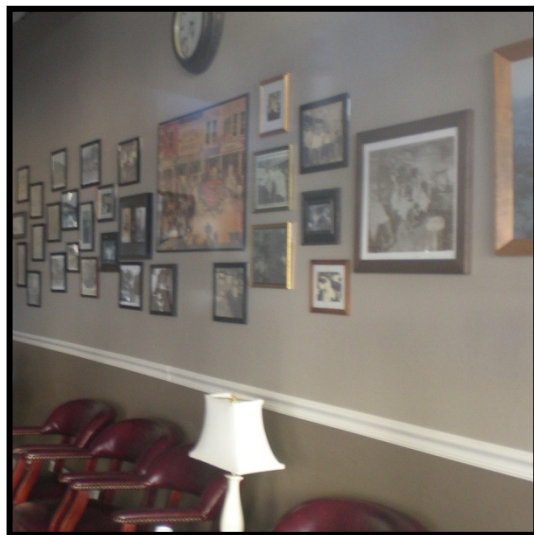

Jamestown is another Gold Rush Country town that at one time had a population of several thousand but today is a tourist town of less than 800. The Main Street looks as it did in the 1880s with the exception of the street parking.



The Old Town Barber Shop is currently a combination barber and beauty shop. If John Baptist were a barber in the 1880 census, it most certainly was in that very store front. The old barber pole resides inside the shop to protect it but the board sidewalks echoed with historic ambiance.

The local museum could not provide any additional information concerning the shop or the barbers. But a visit inside the shop gave me hope.



Inside one entire wall was covered with old time pictures of barbers and their customers in the chairs. The current owner didn't have any idea about the age of the various photos or the names of the barbers or the patrons. Darn! – What do I do now, just claim a good looking one? So I took pictures of all of the ones that were pre-electricity for future reference. The pictures were framed with glass so getting good reproductions without glare was difficult. While good enough for identity purposes, if I found John Baptist, I could always return and ask permission to remove one picture from a frame.

I told myself to just have patience. After all, I did finally find the 1880 census after years of searching. Maybe I will be able to identify John Baptist in the future. Several of the pictures had short little barbers but none of them reminded me of the cute little guy I knew to be my great grandfather. Most of them I wouldn't have tagged as being "drop dead handsome" either.

Surprisingly, I didn't need to cultivate my patience to continue this part of the story. I met with several cousins the following week. Another second cousin showed up with a picture tagged in pencil on the back 'Alphonse' but no date or first names. We all studied the picture and commented, "Good looking people."

Then it was pointed out that a grand-aunt had said she was the little girl on the stool in the center. Bells went off for all of us as we looked at the group. There was my grandmother about six years old on her father's lap – John Baptist's lap. And yes, John Baptist Alphonse was "drop dead handsome!"

The baby was probably two years old sitting on Eugenie's lap, hiding the enlarged waistline that would be the sixth and last Alphonse child born in 1883 in Portland, Oregon. Thus the picture was probably done in Portland. The two oldest daughters and my grandmother were wearing bangs, the latest hair style for the time.

John Baptist has a lush set of mutton chop whiskers hiding some of his face in the picture. When this picture was taken he was said to be a lithographer for a Portland newspaper. Portland in that time period was the third largest city on the west coast behind San Francisco and Los Angeles. All of Eugenie's relatives had migrated north from San Francisco during that time period.

Then I brought out the Jamestown barbershop photos. One by one the cousins and I dismissed them as all of the barbers pictured were too thin, too mousey, etc. Then the picture below jumped out at us and we all knew there was a match! There on the far right next to a generously sized patron in the chair was a tall "drop dead handsome" barber (without his mutton chops). Since the family group picture was at least two years later, John Baptist would have had plenty of time to grow the mutton chop style.

Thus, some of my family folklore has come alive.
