## ***The Elwell Sisters Move to Washington State***

In the late 1860s, several families moved from Franklinville, New York, to Little Sioux, Iowa. Two Elwell sisters moved with the group, Ellen with her husband Joshua Bennett, and my great-grandmother Lucy with my great-grandfather Charles W. Bates. Most of the men who moved were Civil War Veterans, including Joshua and Charles. They went west to get farmland from the Homestead Act of 1862, which granted special benefits to Civil War Veterans.

My grandfather Ora Bates was born in Little Sioux in 1869. Shortly after Ora was born, the families decided to move to Ponca, Nebraska, where they thought the farmland was better. Ponca is on the Missouri River about twenty miles northwest of Sioux City.

In 1874, gold was discovered in the Black Hills, and traffic along the Missouri River increased dramatically as men flocked to the Black Hills in South Dakota seeking their fortune. Ellen's and Lucy's father Cornelius N. Elwell had moved to Ponca by 1880 and worked as a ferryman on the Missouri River. Charles had a blacksmith shop in Ponca.

Natural disasters made life difficult for the Nebraska homesteaders. A devastating grasshopper plague came to Nebraska from New Mexico and Arizona in 1874. In 1875 and 1876, there were smaller hoards of grasshoppers that destroyed the crops for the second and third years in a row. There were bad floods in the area in winters of 1880 and 1881 due to ice dams on the Missouri between Ponca and Sioux City and some years brought severe blizzards .

By 1886, the Bennetts had decided to leave Ponca for Washington Territory. A Ponca newspaper, The Nebraska Journal Leader, ran a series of articles on the Bennett's move.

March 4, 1886

*It is reported that J. E. Bennett is talking of removing to Washington Territory. We regret that so good a citizen is thinking of leaving Ponca.*

March 25, 1886 AUCTION-----

*The undersigned will sell at public auction at his residence in Ponca, Nebraska on Saturday April 3<sup>rd</sup> commencing at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon the following described property to wit: 1 Norman horse, 1 span 2 year old colts, 1 yearling colt, 1 Cooper wagon, 1 set double harness, Jersey cow 3 years old, 2 new steel scrapers, a number of head of cows, steers, heifers and calves. Will also sell on the same day, if not sold before, my house, barn and 3 lots. Terms of the sale on sums of less than \$10.00, cash. On sums of \$10.00 or over, one years credit will be given on approved notes with interest at 10%. Five percent off for cash. J. E. Bennett*



**Ellen Elwell Bennett**

May 20, 1886

*A letter received a few days ago from JE Bennett by his family in this place. It appears in this letter that he arrived safely in Washington Territory and that he likes that country very much. He finds everything according to his expectations and has purchased a tract of timber land and proposes to make that his home in future. His family will sell out their property here and join him as soon as possible.*

August 12, 1886

*Mrs. J.E. Bennett is arranging to start Monday for Washington Territory where Mr. Bennett went last spring, and where he has bought a farm and will in future reside. Ponca will suffer the loss of Mrs. Bennett and her family.*

May 16, 1889

*On Monday evening we received from our much esteemed friends, Mr. and Mrs. Bennett of Woodinville, Washington Territory, a package containing samples of the grass and clover of Wash Territory, also of flowers, fruits, etc. They write that flowers have been in bloom there since Feb. From these samples it appears that the growth of vegetation in that country is far in advance of what is here. Mr. and Mrs. Bennett live in the western part of the territory where the trees are so big that it is quite a journey around one and where everything else is on the same gigantic scale. We are glad to hear that Mr. and Mrs. Bennett are well and prosperous, and thank them for the specimens sent us.*

Meanwhile, Charles and Lucy had fallen on hard times. They lost their property in 1888, and Lucy said their problems were due to Charles's drinking. In a case that eventually went to the Nebraska Supreme Court, Lucy sued three Ponca saloon owners alleging that from September 30, 1883, to September 9, 1885, they sold her husband Charles intoxicating liquors and made him addicted to alcohol and a habitual drunkard. She said that while Charles was intoxicated, he was profane, cruel, and abusive to her and their children.

*"The testimony tends to show that C. W. Bates, the husband, before he became addicted to the habitual use of intoxicating liquors, was a skilled mechanic, a kind husband, and considerate father, and was earning \$3 to \$5 per day; that during the time stated in the petition he procured intoxicating liquors from the three saloons of the plaintiff in error, and that during the time he almost wholly failed to provide for his wife and family; that his wife by washing, ironing and other labors, had been compelled to provide for her own wants and for her children. The testimony also shows that Bates was naturally industrious. As expressed by the one of the witnesses, "There was not a lazy hair on his head." The cause of the loss of means of support is clearly shown by have been the intoxication of Bates."<sup>1</sup>*

Lucy asked for \$8,000 in damages for lost support. A jury awarded her \$600. The defendants appealed the verdict, which went to the Nebraska Supreme Court and was heard on June 13, 1889. In the case of *E. H. JONES et al. Plfts in Err., v. Lucy A. BATES et.al*, the Nebraska Supreme Court upheld the judgment. The court wrote, "*It is apparent that the verdict should have been for a much larger sum.*" This ruling established that "*Vendors of intoxicating liquors who separately sell to a man who by thus imbibing in a period of several years becomes an habitual drunkard, are in law jointly and severally liable for that result.*"<sup>2</sup>

Lucy filed for a divorce from her husband Charles and was granted a divorce and custody of her minor children on November 12, 1888. Shortly after her divorce, she moved to Washington State to join her sister Ellen. Her three youngest sons, Ora, Merritt and Robert, came with her. Her two older sons, Asa and Manley, stayed in Ponca and later moved to Sioux City.

Lucy and her sons settled around Seattle. Her sister Ellen was divorced from her husband Joshua Bennett in 1889 in Snohomish County, Washington. Lucy married James Eugene Clark on August 3, 1890, in Seattle. Lucy and James settled in Edmonds, Washington. Ellen also remarried. At some point, their father C. N. Elwell joined his daughters in Washington State, although he did not live with them. According to his death certificate, he was living in an almshouse when he died in Seattle on July 16, 1908.

Lucy's son Robert Bates lived in Littlerock, Washington, in the 1910 census and later moved to Puyallup. By 1912, Ora Bates had moved to Maytown in Thurston County. Lucy died in Edmonds on February 9, 1920. Ellen died the next month on March 18, 1920, in Seattle. Lucy and Ellen lived close to each other for most of their lives. Charles W. Bates, the "habitual drunkard", outlived them both, dying in Idaho on March 28, 1933. He was at least 96 years old by then and claimed to be 98. He must have given up drinking alcohol, since he lived to such an advanced age under the care of a Mormon family for about 25 years.

## A Query and a Brick Wall

I am happy to become a member of OGS. I am also a member of the Camwood Genealogical Society in Stanwood, Washington. I thought I would give you some information so you can see why I am particularly interested in the Olympia area. I am not expecting a miracle, just reaching out as was described by our seminar leader, Thomas MacEntee, this weekend.

My areas of genealogical interest are mostly in the Olympia-Shelton area. My father, Caleb John Sorensen, lived in Olympia, at the corner of East Bay Drive and San Francisco Street from the time he was about one year old until he left home. His mother, Mary Anne Sorensen, lived there until she was quite elderly. My great-grandmother, Hanna Beatty, also lived there for many years until she passed away.

I have done extensive research on the Sorensen line (Danish) and learned that my grandfather, Soren Sorensen probably settled in Olympia because he had an uncle, Jens Frederiksen, born ca. 1860/61 was living in Chambers Prairie (1900 and 1910 census returns). An uncle Frederiksen is mentioned in Soren's 1904 obituary in the Olympia paper.

I am interested in any descendents of the *Frederiksen* family.

A "brick wall" for me is my grandmother, born Mary Ann Beatty and her mother Hanna or Hannah Beatty. Both were born in Ireland (Sligo or County Longford (Langford)) and I have found no records of them through Irish sources. As you can see from the chart, Hanna had several siblings who also settled in the Olympia area. Family names *of Murphy, Beatty, Taylor, McGuigan and Goodro* are possible descendants who might have information.

Hanna's death certificate show her parents as John Beatty and Frances Howard and lists her as widowed but I have no clue as to whether she was ever married or to whom---was he also a Beatty? Or was she not really born a Beatty?

I do have one other name, *Eaton, or Van Eaton*. Mrs. Eaton was very nice to my father when he was a child (circa 1910) and I believe that Mary Anne may have worked for them (as a maid probably). Van Eaton was a friend of my father when they were children. I believe the Eaton Family were of a "higher" class. I have a letter from Mrs. Eaton to my grandmother and also a picture that I believe is Van, in a football uniform. I think that they lived in one of the lovely old homes that was on East Bay Drive.
