A Message from OGS President Eileen Dodge

Most of us have done a great deal of research, collected many documents and have files of paperwork. What will happen to your research when you are gone? Is anyone else in the family interested?

Recently in Dutchess County, New York a family matriarch died and her heirs have cleared out her house. The family roots go back to the early 1700s and the property has been in the same family from the day it was originally purchased. The house is currently on the market.

Everything in the house has been sold at auction, including old letters and original documents. Among the papers was a collection of genealogical research done in the 1800s. The researcher had traveled to Europe, wrote many letters and saved it all. Unfortunately, she did not write up her findings, the later heirs did not make any provision for these records, and the current generation is not interested.

Think about all of the work you've done and put a plan in place to preserve your work. Talk to your relatives about what you want done with the files and documents. Organize your research so it's easy for someone to review. Think about publishing your work in some fashion. It doesn't have to be a book - perhaps some short stories about the family, a blog, or photocopies of the family history.

Using a computer generated genealogy software program (Family Tree Maker, Generations, Reunion, Legacy, Personal Ancestral File, RootsMagic, etc.) will provide you with comprehensive reports and charts so you can organize and see the progress of your research. Organizational tools link people together based on relationships, merge individuals into family trees, help spot problems and locate duplicate entries.

Software for digital scrapbooking and graphics software programs for digital scrapbooking provide a wide variety of pre-made templates and elements that let you create beautiful scrapbook pages without a lot of graphics knowledge. The page background, text, and other decorations are all arranged and formatted on the computer, and then printed out as a single page. Photographs can be attached to the page as well. Digital scrapbooking instead of the traditional scrapbook route means less money spent on supplies, and the ability to print out multiple copies.

Ella Mabel Smith
First Librarian at the Carnegie Library in Olympia, Washington

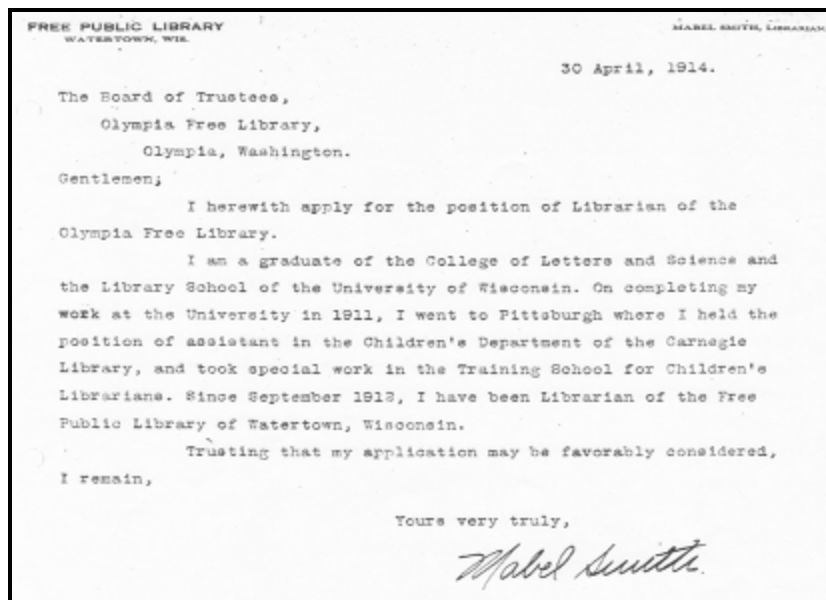
When long time library supporter, Winnifred L. Olsen, moved out of her house several years ago, she told us she had some old records from the Carnegie building at 7th and Franklin. She laughed when I offered her two empty file drawers in the back room of the “new” Olympia Timberland Library. It turns out, she had rescued 10+ boxes of material when the library moved in 1978. She used some of that information to develop the informative display now in the Olympia Library meeting room. The boxes were placed on the very highest shelf where they stayed, unopened, for several years. One of my off-desk projects when I still worked at the library was to make a list of the contents and I continued with this after I retired with the help of Antonio Scaparelli who muscled the boxes down one at a time. This turned out to be a treasure trove of letters, scrapbooks, record books and more pertaining to the early Olympia Library. There is a copy of the minutes of the first library board (members Miss Janet Moore, Mrs. George Gaston, Rev. Mr. D.A. Thompson, Mr. J.M. Hitt and Miss Quinn Trott) which had formed in 1911 and covers the period of the building of the Carnegie Library.

The Olympia Public Library was many years in the making, when, in 1913, they were granted \$25,000 by the Carnegie Foundation to build and furnish a library. This gift was not without caveats. Both the city of Olympia¹ and Thurston County² had to guarantee funds to maintain the library and library service. Each agreed to the sum of \$1500 per year. In 1913, the library was housed in one room of the Old City Hall where it had moved after the Woman’s Club burned. It was funded by a 7/20th mil levy. The most recent librarian, Miss Quinn Trott, was paid \$35 per month and circulation was between 700 and 800+ volumes a month that summer. A new facility was clearly needed to serve both the city and rural areas of Thurston County.

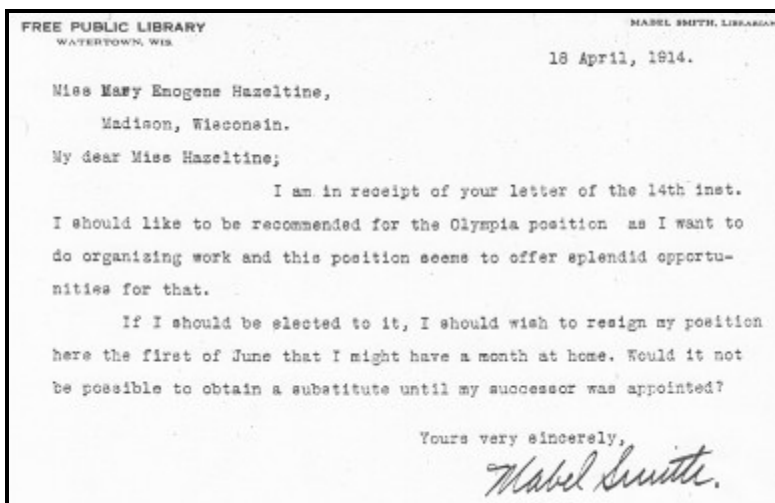
Once the grant was awarded, the Board went ahead with amazing speed. Just one week later on August 20, 1913, the board fixed the site of the new building: a 120 X 120 foot lot on the northeast corner of Franklin and 7th streets was obtained by exchange of certain city property together with a levy of \$3500 on the City tax roll which the landowner agreed to. The architectural firm of Blackwell, Baker and Wohleb were hired to design the building.

Nine months later, on March 30, 1914, the contract for building construction was given to Knoell Bros. of Tacoma who had the low bid (\$17,849) of 14 submitted by contractors from throughout the state. This left some \$7,000 for library furniture, fixtures and grounds. Work began on site development on April 2, 1914, and the work moved forward so quickly that the cornerstone was laid with great ceremony on May 6th. It was planned that the library would open in September.

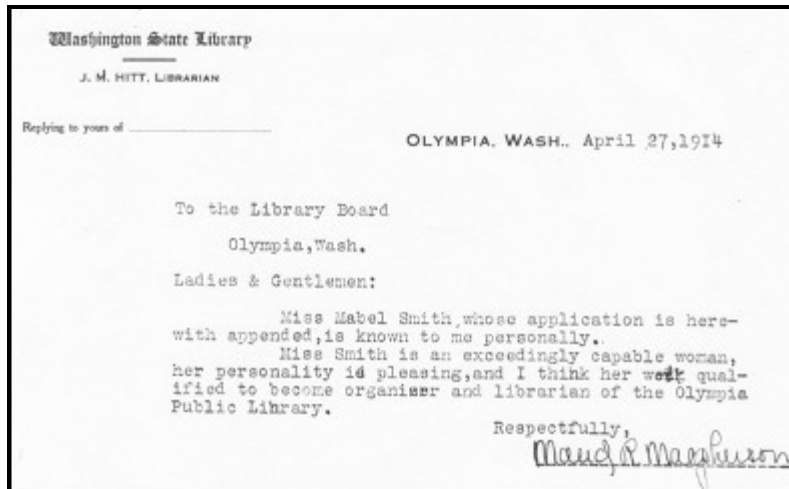
Even before ground was broken on the library building, it was decided by the board that a trained librarian should be hired to organize the new library. Mr. Hitt, member of the board and the state librarian, contacted Miss Mary Frances Isom and Miss Cornelia Marvin, both women then active in developing public libraries in Oregon, to recommend suitable candidates. Miss Isom was a founder of the Oregon Library Association, Pacific Northwest Library Association and President of the American of the American Library Association, while Miss Marvin had been Secretary to the Wisconsin Library Commission and together they were able to make the position in Olympia known. Eleven people eventually applied for the position and 3 were chosen as finalists: Miss Katharine Tappart of Davenport, Iowa, Miss Helen M. Crane of Valley City, North Dakota, and Miss Ella Mabel Smith Watertown, Wisconsin. Copies of the applications from Miss Tappart and Miss Crane were not found in the Olympia Library archives, but Miss Smith’s application reads:



Miss Hazeltine from the University of Wisconsin Library School had notified her about the opening in Olympia and Mabel (she always went by Mabel never Ella, a name she shared with her mother) wrote to ask her for a recommendation.



In addition, she had a recommendation from Miss Maud R. Macpherson of the Washington State Library. Miss Macpherson had preceded Mabel by several years at the Watertown Free Library. She moved to Hoquiam, Washington, in 1909 to organize the library in that town. It may have been her recommendation which gave Mabel the edge. In those days travel was by train and still slow, so none of the candidates were brought to Olympia for an in person interview.

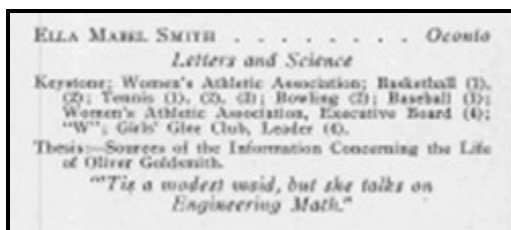


Who was Mabel Smith? From the Wisconsin birth and death records on Ancestry.com, I found that Mabel was born on March 2, 1887, in Oconto, Wisconsin, to William K. Smith and Charlotte Ella Newbanks Smith. The 1900 Federal Census lists 3 older siblings, William, Charles, and Rhoda and a younger brother, Philip. Her father was listed as a cashier (later to be a director and vice-president) of the Oconto National bank.

The amazing Oconto County Wisconsin GenWeb page coordinated by RITA has transcriptions from the local newspaper, the Oconto Reporter, social and personal column covering many years. Some of the entries about the Smith family show Mr. Smith traveling frequently for bank business, growing sugar beets on his farm and on one occasion having a verbal altercation with an irate bank customer in the middle of the street. Mrs. Smith belonged to several clubs and gave parties frequently, once on the front porch of her home. The oldest boy, William, had a “nasty” accident on his velocipede. Relatives came to visit from Vermont and New York. Mabel’s older sister, Rhoda, provided piano accompaniment for a local singer. In 1902 Mabel (wrongly listed as two girls, Ella and Mabel) and Rhoda were taken by their mother to Lake Forest, Illinois, to enter Ferry Hall, a boarding school for girls affiliated with Lake Forest College.

Ferry Hall was not just a finishing school, but a preparatory school that included art, science, mathematics, physical education, music and domestic science. Found on the Internet Archive website is the 1905 yearbook for Ferry Hall, The Forrester, which listed Mabel as Treasurer of the Junior Preparatory Class and a member of the Leschitzky(sic) Club which was reserved for girls who met “the requirements of the fifth year of the Ferry Hall Musical Course”.

After Ferry Hall, Mabel went to the University of Wisconsin where she played on and was captain of the tennis team, was leader of the Glee Club, and took the long course in Library Science in addition to earning a degree in Letters and Science.

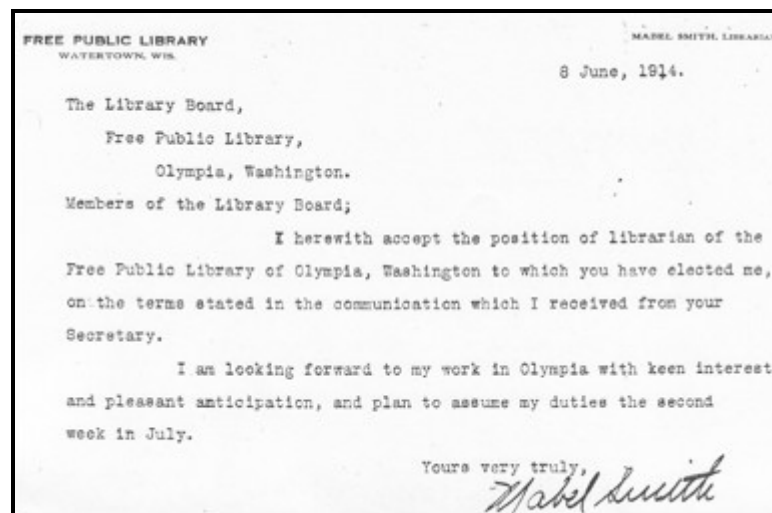


This information is from the 1912 Badger Yearbook in University of Wisconsin’s digital collections.

She furthered her library education at the Carnegie Library in Pittsburgh which had a training school for children's librarians. The course lasted one year for those students from an accredited library school on recommendation from that school's director. While in Pittsburgh, she was also an assistant in the Library's Children's Room.

In August of 1912, the Watertown, Wisconsin, newspaper the Watertown Gazette wrote: "Miss Mabel Smith of Oconto was appointed librarian.....last Tuesday by the library board [of Watertown Wisconsin] at a salary of \$60 a month. She is a graduate of Terry (sic) Hall, The University of Wisconsin long course library school at Madison and took a special children's course at the Pittsburg, Pa., library school and has been an assistant there. She comes to Watertown very highly recommended".

After nearly two years at Watertown Public Library, Mabel was ready for a bigger challenge. She was chosen librarian for the new Carnegie Library in Olympia, Washington, which was not yet completed.



Her salary started at \$90 per month and would be increased to \$100 after six months if her work was satisfactory. Instead of a month of vacation she hoped for, Mabel left the day of her acceptance letter to travel to Madison, Wisconsin, "to confer with Miss Bascom of the [Wisconsin Free Library] Commission in regard to the book order the Board wishes me to enter". Armed only with plans of the new library and a shelf list of books in the current collection, Mabel was not only given the task of buying books for the new library, she also needed to order furniture and advise on other furnishings. On June 13, she writes:

"My Dear Mr. Hitt;

The work on the book order progresses slowly as it is somewhat of a problem to make a selection for a strange community. I am putting in only general books of non-fiction leaving books for the special needs of the public for later purchase. It is my plan to include in the \$400 order which you wish sent in at once fiction, children's books and some popular non-fiction. The further list of \$300 will include standard non-fiction and reference books which will be needed in the work with schools and the county. I will send in the latter order at the same time but ask that it be held until I reach Olympia and confer with you and Miss Macpherson in regard to it. Are there any reference books at all in the Library? There is no record of them at all in the shelf list.

Do you subscribe to magazines? I notice from the shelf list that the library has but a very few. I will make up a list and send it in when I hear from you.

Yours sincerely,
Mabel Smith"

On June 17 she inquired as to the need for such supplies as reader's cards, application blanks, book pockets, book labels and dating slips and asks for samples of those in use to be matched. On June 23, she sent a list of furniture she would order from the Library Bureau to be delivered to Olympia by the 20th of August noting that the librarian's desk, display shelves, magazine and newspaper racks, umbrella rack, and first floor furnishing could be obtained locally in Olympia. And, of course, a typewriter which along with the telephone and electric clock (rented) were the sole bits of technology in 1914. She recommended rattan porch furniture for the women's rest room as well as a steel couch with a washable cover. The restroom and mothers' retiring room were an important part of the new library whose patrons would be traveling to town from rural Thurston county. The tables and chairs for the reading room were in quarter sawn oak with an antique finish and, although the table dimensions are somewhat different than those in the order, are probably those still in use at the 'new' Olympia Library. At the end of this last letter, she again requested time for vacation before she headed west. We know from the transcriptions of the Oconto Times she went home.

Miss Mabel Smith arrived in Olympia Washington, on July 21, 1914, in time for a special meeting with the Library Board on July 24. She is listed in the Olympia City directories as living at 728 Main Street which in the 1908 and 1924 Sanborn Maps is shown as a dwelling, possibly a boarding house.

All of the Board Members were present at that meeting. Mabel immediately replaced Quinn Trott as secretary and recorded the minutes. Bills for telegrams relating to the hiring of the librarian (\$1.70) were paid and applications for the janitor for the new building were filed. It was moved and carried that the additional list of books (\$300) be ordered. Mr. Hitt, the state librarian, and Miss Smith would make a list of magazines for the library. Mr. Hitt would also look into insurance for the new building. Approval was given for Miss Smith to attend the Pacific Northwest Library Association conference in Spokane September 3-5, and her train fare paid. She would present a paper on county library work. Miss Quinn Trott, the part-time outgoing librarian, would remain for 3 months to help get the library up and running. There are no records in the archives to reveal Miss Trott's feelings about being replaced. It was also moved and seconded that the University of Washington be contacted to secure extension lectures to be held at the library (200 chairs had been ordered for the downstairs auditorium).

The Carnegie library was scheduled to open on September 7th and with that in mind, the library room in the City Hall was closed on August 10. By August 22, it was apparent the new library would not be ready because the fixtures had not arrived in time. The Morning Olympian reported, "The new librarian, Miss Smith and her assistant Miss Quinn Trott, are busily engaged in work on the books which are being arranged so that all confusion and delay will be eliminated when the new shelves are ready for their reception. Miss Smith states that there are still a number of books out and requests that their holders return them to M. O'Connor's".

The furniture finally arrived and the dedication of the Olympia Public Library was scheduled for Saturday, October 3, 1914. Services to the public would begin on Monday, October 5. Neither the newspaper or library archives noted Mabel's part in the dedication. Possibly she conducted the tours which followed.

The library was meant to serve both city and county. Four branches were planned at Rochester, Yelm, Tenino and Union Mills. Mabel traveled to Union Mills on Tuesday evening, October 6, reported the Morning Olympian "to make the necessary arrangements for placing a circulating library of about 50 volumes there in charge of a temporary attendant. The books will be kept in the lobby of the Union Mills Hotel, if present plans work out, where they will be accessible for the people of the community under the same conditions as are the books in the central library. It is the plan of Miss Smith and the library board to establish circulating branches in all of the community centers of the county. The first one was established at Rochester, and plans are understood to be under way for one at Tenino". By January 1915, there was also a branch or substation at Yelm.

No record was found that records Mabel's feeling or reaction to her new job or Olympia. We know from the personal/society columns of the local newspapers that she began a story time on November 7.

That first October there was a "county fair" in the auditorium where local children displayed their woodwork, needlework, produce, preserves and baking. Later the library in conjunction with the local bird group held a bird house contest. The results of which were placed in local parks.

Adults were able to attend lectures given by visiting professors and representative from state government the proceeds (10¢ per person) to benefit the book fund.

Over the next three years, Mabel gave talks at the local schools, wrote reports to the board (she resigned as secretary when the library opened) and local newspapers. She arranged an exhibit of books and engraving relating to Shakespeare's life and plays. When the United States went to war, Mabel developed a bulletin board of maps and news articles so patrons could follow the progress of the troops. She, along with other women of the town, attended first aid classes given by a local doctor. Each year Mabel went home to Wisconsin, and finally in June 1917, she resigned to take up a position at the Detroit Public Library. An article in the Morning Olympia quotes Miss Janet Moore, library board president, "Miss Smith has given exceptionally efficient service during her three years here and the board is sorry to lose her". It was noted circulation had tripled.

Mabel left Olympia on July 3, 1917, and the November ALA Bulletin listed her as an assistant at the Detroit Public Library, but there were other things going on in her life beside library work, because on January 18, 1918, she was married to Earle Bollinger Williams in Seattle.

Mr. Williams had been working for the Bureau of Land Management in Olympia according to his WWI draft registration card. He was from Cape Girardeau, Missouri, and attended the University of Michigan. On April 18, 1916, while in Olympia, he joined the Sons of the American Revolution giving his profession as surveyor. He served 1918-1919 in the Army Quarter Master Corps for which the local chapter presented "a beautiful bronze medal on ribbons" to him and three others who served in the Great War, but by then, 1922, he and Mabel had moved on.

The last reports I found in the Olympia newspapers were the announcement issued by her mother in June 1918 of Mabel's marriage, and the notice on 11 July 1918, "Mr. and Mrs. Earle B. Williams of Camp Lewis were entertained by Judge and Mrs. O. C. Ellis in Tacoma".

On 9 September 1918, the Library Journal reported "Mrs. Mabel Smith Williams has been appointed librarian at the Yesler Branch of the Seattle Public Library to fill a temporary position". The address she gave the University of Wisconsin Alumni magazine was 429 Walker Building, Seattle.

The information grows even sketchier. In 1920, Mabel and Earl were living in Centerville (now Stanwood, WA), and by the middle of the 1920s they have moved to Pawhuska, Oklahoma, when Mabel becomes a life member of the University of Wisconsin Alumni Association. By the 1930 Federal Census, they lived in Amarillo, Texas. Earle gave his profession as contractor and Mabel listed no occupation. The 1935 South Dakota state census showed the couple living in Deadwood for the previous 6 months. Earl was working for the Forest Service and Mabel was a housewife. The last available census, 1940, has them in Longview, Texas. Starting in 1912 Mabel was a member (#5445) of the American Library Association, but a query to the ALA archives revealed no listings after 1920.

Mabel and Earle may have retired to Cape Girardeau, Missouri, but with some connection to St. Cloud, Minnesota where Mabel died in 1968. Her obituary only says that she was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Presbyterian Church, and was survived by her husband and one brother, Philip, in Detroit, Michigan. Earle died in 1976 and the very brief obituaries say they were buried in Jackson Missouri, but they are not in Find-a-Grave although the cemeteries are well documented.

All of the above information is interesting and forms an intriguing outline of Mabel Smith Williams' life, but we don't know if she was happy or what other places she might have lived between censuses, communicated with the University of Wisconsin alumni magazine or discussed in newspaper stories. What did she do with her days? Did she work in libraries again? Play tennis and sing in choral groups? Possibly someone reading this is related and can fill the blanks.

The originals of all the letters quoted or pictured in this article are in the archives at the Olympia Timberland Library. There is also a copy of the first volume of the minutes of the Olympia Public Library board and a copy of an early scrapbook containing newspaper clippings. A display of these and other items is planned for October 2014 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the opening of the Carnegie building. In addition local historian, Shanna Stevenson will be publishing a book about the history of library service in Olympia.

Early years of Olympia newspapers, the *Morning Olympian* and others, are in microfilm in the Olympia Timberland Library and the Washington State Library. Some years (1891-1927) are also in a searchable database on *GenealogyBank.com*. The *Olympian* from 2001 is in searchable format in *Newsbank* database which is available in all Timberland Libraries and through the library website.

The Olympia Timberland Library also has a collection of local City Directories and the Sanborn Map database for Washington State which were helpful in researching this story.

The following pages from the Olympia City Directory 1923-24 are continued from the July 2013 OGS Quarterly. This series started in July 2008. The original of this book is at the Olympia Timberland Library.
