Milwaukee County Genealogical Society August 2013. Do you remember the CCC? Better known as Civilian Conservation Corps which was established in 1933 by President Roosevelt to put Americans to work during the depression. The article on its history up to WW II in 1942 should be of interest if your family members were part of the 3 million men who participated.

South King County News Sep/Oct 2013. A fascinating story in this issue on a *Daughter's Discovery*. Her search for relatives after her dad left the family and she discovered he had been married 3 times and abandoned all his families. She found many family members and is now doing DNA to find out more. Never underestimate a genealogist.

Whitman County Genealogical Society October 2013. Cemeteries are the theme of this issue. *My Cemetery Adventures* tells of 2 families who met when both visited a grave in a cemetery in Lake County California at same time. Also, a list of Whitman County cemeteries and several other stories.

Whitman County Genealogical Society November & December 2013 and January 2014. Review of a book called Hey, America your Roots Are Showing by Megan Smolenyak author of Who Do You Think You Are. She has also collected Bible records which can be found on www.biblerecords.com

Milwaukee County Genealogical Society November 2013. Article on cemetery and gravestone care. Do your homework ahead. Create a cemetery to kit clean and/or photograph stones.

South King County News Nov/Dec 2013. *Family History is NOT just an Older Person's Hobby* is a discussion of the generation gap in genealogy.

Hill, Woodall and DeBoe Families Move from Crittenden County, Kentucky, to Washington State

Crittenden County is a small, rural county in western Kentucky bordering the Ohio River. The Hill family resided there by 1799, and in 1831 the Woodall and DeBoe families migrated from Pittsylvania County, Virginia, to Crittenden County. Members of the Woodall and DeBoe families had married, and the Hill family joined in after the move to Kentucky. In one Woodall/Hill/Deboe family, four sets of first cousins married.

Around 1900, many of these family members decided to move to the Yakima Valley in Washington State. Other Crittenden families joined them, including the Jacobs, Cole, Stovall, Scott, Rushing, Farmer and Crayne families. Why had they decided to move to Yakima Valley? Violet Hill Carpenter and Paul and Geneva Woodall wrote a book, "YOU ALL COME, A Migration from Crittenden County, Ky., to the Yakima Valley 1888 – 1923", about this migration. The book is undated and has been out of print for many years.

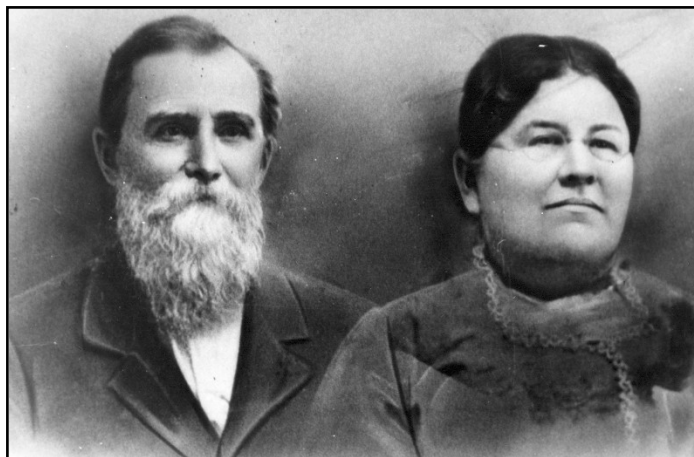
In 1864 during the Civil War, Congress chartered the Northern Pacific Railroad to lay tracks from Lake Superior to Puget Sound. For each mile of track laid in Washington State, the Northern Pacific Railway was granted 40 square miles of land. These very generous land grants were designed to promote western development, reasoning that the land had little value until served by a good transportation system. After tracks were laid from Pasco to Yakima in 1884, the Northern Pacific Railroad then promoted the region and hired agents to sell land. The Railroad owned half of the land in the Yakima Valley.

Persuaded by the Northern Pacific Railway advertisements and recruiters, Hasdon Hill of Crittenden County, Kentucky, came to Washington State in 1887. He stayed in Tacoma for a year and then moved on to Yakima. Dry farmland was being transformed into productive farmland as irrigation canals were dug from the Yakima River. Hops were one of the first crops grown on the newly-irrigated land.

Three times Hasdon Hill returned to Kentucky and recruited his family members to come to the Yakima Valley. *"To him, it was a mission. He wanted to free his isolated kinfolk. He wanted them to have new bloodlines in their veins, and to learn new ways that differed from their self-sufficient backwoods customs."* Several accounts of this migration are included in "YOU ALL COME". Here is an example written by Hasdon Hill's niece, Ida Rushing.

"There were tears and parties and prayers and great excitement when we loaded our belongings into 'immigrant' cars to leave our native Kentucky for Washington State. Our emotions were mingled. We wanted to go and hated to leave. Our Old Kentucky Homes had been sold to pay our passage. Our personal belongings were mostly feather beds plucked from geese of our own, homemade clothing, including sunbonnets, hand-quilted bedding and our kitchen utensils. We packed lunches to see us through the four-day trip. Many of us had never been more than a few miles from our Kentucky woods. Our own ancestry had followed Daniel Boone's wilderness trails and had hewn our farms of cotton, cane and tobacco out the hardwood forests. We were of

clannish ancestry, intermarried, backwoods-schooled and Calvinistic of doctrine ... Now, we were a sort of run out generation freed by the coming of the railways and ready for pioneering in Washington State where the promise of plenty was our motivation."

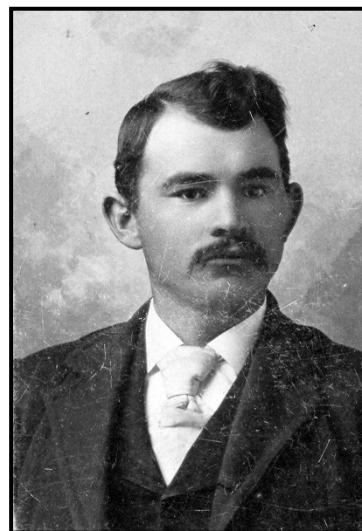

My great-grandparents John and Velenia Woodall came with their children William, Susan, Thomas, Irene, Alfred Elmer, Laura, and Mina. Milton Woodall was their only child to stay in Crittenden County. Migrating with them were many from the Woodall, Hill and DeBoe families, although no one with the surname DeBoe came. About 200 people came in three groups during 1904 and 1905. Other relatives came later, encouraged by stories from their family. People quickly got jobs in the hop and fruit industries. The family traded tobacco farming for hop farming.

Newspaper articles from Toppenish and Zillah around 1904 reported on the family migration to the Yakima Valley.

“Sixty-five natives, men, women and children of the State of Kentucky and the Counties of Crittenden and Caldwell arrived at Toppenish last Sunday to cast their fortune in the glorious Yakima Valley.

Some forty of them concluded to locate in the vicinity of Toppenish and Zillah. They are nice, thrifty looking class of people, and, as such, are gladly welcomed. ...

Mr. H. C. (Hasdon) Hill of Zillah is the man who induced this migration. Mr. Hill is an old Kentuckian and is confident of the people of the blue grass state and also of the future of the Yakima Valley. Be it said to his credit that every man, woman and child has been provided with a pleasant position and there is room for many more.”

“Toppenish, Washington:

The biggest carload of immigrants ever landed here, arrived on March 19, and yet, there is room for more. It was amazing to see how quickly all found homes and work at good prices. ...

Mrs. Crane is looking fine and likes the country. She won't be returning to Kentucky soon. Miss Laura Woodall has a fine place to stay. In fact, everybody in the Yakima Valley has a fine place to stay. We have such beautiful scenery, mild climate. The roads have been so good all winter that we can haul a ton to a horse anywhere.

We have the most productive and richest soil this side of the land of Goshen in Egypt. We grow to perfection every kind of fruit and vegetable. The railroad runs through the Valley and you never seen an empty car setting on a sidetrack over its limited time to be loaded. We are shipping every month of the year. I will say to my friends in Crittenden County, Kentucky, if you want to seek a home in the Northwest, you cannot do better than the Yakima Valley.”

There are many descendants of these families living in Yakima Valley. Many other descendants spread out across Washington State, with some of the members, including my grandmother and father, ending up in Olympia. One of the more colorful members of the family was Perry B. Woodall, state representative and senator from Zillah, serving from 1939 to 1974 in the Washington State Legislature.

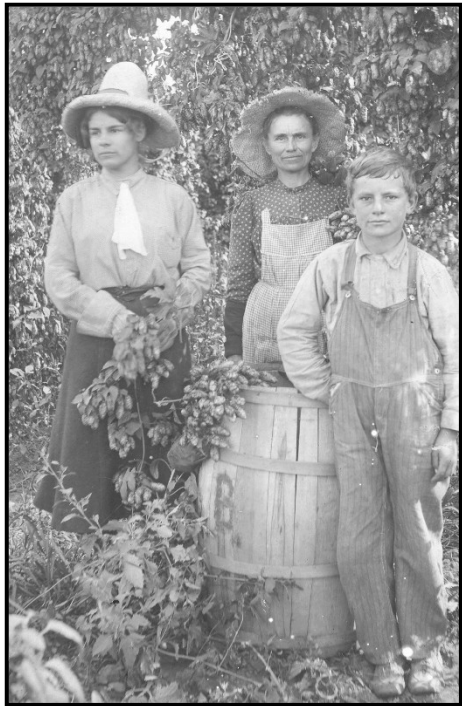

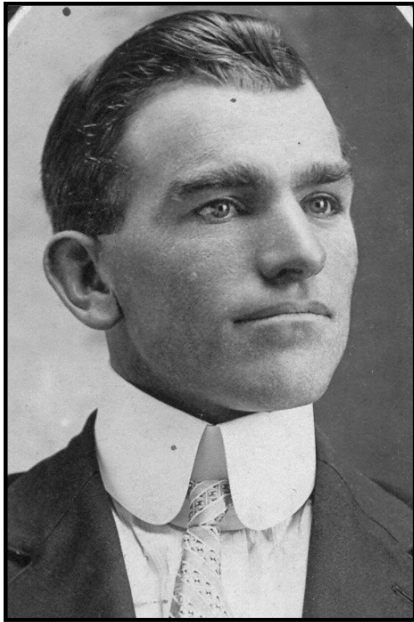
