

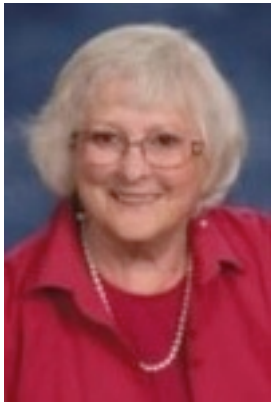

It goes to respecting their hardships and losses, their never giving in or giving up, their resoluteness to go on and build a life for their family. It goes to deep pride that the fathers fought, and some died to make and keep us a nation. It goes to a deep and immense understanding that they were doing it for us.

It is of equal pride and love that our mothers struggled to give us birth, without them we could not exist, and so we love each one, as far back as we can reach. That we might be born who we are. That we might remember them. So we do. With love and caring and scribing each fact of their existence, because we are they and they are the sum of who we are.”

Maureen “Mickey” Alice (Dorcy) Hannah



Maureen “Mickey” Alice (Dorcy) Hannah died of natural causes on January 27, 2014; at the home she loved on Spencer Lake. She was born on June 7, 1928 at Bellingham, Washington. Her husband, Wayne E. Hannah, preceded Mickey in death.

Both Mickey and Wayne were very active in the Olympia Genealogy Society for many years. She wrote several books including “A Hannah family of West Virginia” “The descendants of John Dorcy, Civil War soldier” and edited the 1910 Thurston Federal Census transcription project.

Also preceding her in death were her parents, William T. and Sylva A. (Miller) Dorcy, a sister Laura (Dorcy) King, and a brother, William V. Dorcy.

She is survived by sons Thomas, James, Daniel, Joseph, Christopher and Benjamin Hannah; daughters Teresa (Hannah) Crichton and Jean Hannah; brother Bernard Dorcy, sisters Sylva (Dorcy) Bemis, Aileen (Dorcy) Covert, Bonnie (Dorcy) Meyer, and Judith (Dorcy) White; 23 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.

Mickey attended Bellingham High School and Washington State University where she began studies as a pharmacy technician. She loved swimming in and sailing on Puget Sound and was very athletic in her youth.

In college, she met Wayne Edward Hannah, her husband for 57 years, until his death in 2005. Mickey soon became a homemaker and the mother of 8 children, her life's work. She was an avid homemaker, excellent seamstress, great cook, and had a special talent for arranging flowers. She focused her life on her eight children, played tennis and was certified as a Master Catechist, teaching religious education at her parish for many years.

She and Wayne became interested in genealogy, and over many years they compiled a 2,000-person family tree. They authored several books on the subject, and leave a lasting treasure for their offspring.

Mickey was an active member of St Edward Parish, where Rosary Mass were held, followed by a graveside service at Shelton Memorial Park and a celebration of life at the Shelton Civic Center. Arrangements were made by McComb and Wagner Family Funeral Home and Crematory.

Edna Doris Cutler Peebles, longtime member of the Olympia Genealogical Society and member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, passed away peacefully on March 26, 2014, in Lacey, Washington.

She was born on December 30, 1921, to Burt and Esther Libe Cutler, in Livingston, Montana.

Edna always considered herself a tomboy and the small Montana town afforded her many outdoor adventures. She moved after high school to Spokane, Washington, to attend and graduate from Kinman Business College.

She met the love of her life, Harold A. Peebles, at Kinman. They were married on April 8, 1944, in Spokane. Harold and Edna lived the majority of their married lives in Spokane. They had three sons, Bruce (deceased), Scott, and Chris.

In the '70s, Edna attained a life goal by graduating from Eastern Washington University.

Once Harold retired as a partner at LeMasters Daniels CPA firm, they began to travel throughout the United States. Their joint hobby of genealogy, along with memberships in Sons of the American Revolution and Daughters of the American Revolution, made their trips even richer. Edna was especially proud of her pre-revolutionary ancestors.

A few years after Harold passed away, Edna moved to the Lacey area to be near her grandchildren, where she attended many Timberline High School activities. She developed friendships with members of OGS, DAR, The Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, and Christ the Servant Lutheran.

What mattered most to her was her family. She was especially proud of her sons, two grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Edna is survived by her sons, Chris and Scott and wife, Nancy; grandson, Addam, and his wife, Shannon; granddaughter, Amanda, and her husband, Daniel; and four great grandchildren, Devon, Naomi, Andrew, and Emerson.

Chelan Valley Genealogy Society, January 2014

We are all aware of bucket lists, thing to do before you die. This issue has a Genealogy Bucket List of five “must do” activities. If we did all of these we can die happy:

1. Research at the Family History Library in Salt Lake. Although many of their resources are available on line or through microfilm loan at Family History Centers, there are many advantages to go there in person.
2. Visit an ancestor's homeland whether in this country or overseas. Be sure to research ahead on resources available and what you want to accomplish. Nothing like seeing the real place.
3. Attend a national conference These are held in various locations throughout the country. If the cost or travel prohibits this, attend smaller local seminars such as we have each year.
4. Knock down at least one brick wall. Concentrate on one ancestral line in detail such as consulting a professional genealogist. Keep track of all sources you've searched and places you have gone and branch out.
5. Publish your research. Whether you use a blog, website, or printed book, publish to help other researchers. This should insure your hard work is preserved for later generations

Fiske Genealogical Foundation, Seattle, Newsletter, Fall 2013

There are several informative articles on sources found in this Seattle library. It lists recent acquisitions, a review of a new book on New York in the Revolution and on Colonial Wars of North America [1512-1763](#). There is also an article on reading handwriting should be helpful to everyone.

Ft Worth Genealogy Society, August 2013

Geico's Fort Worth Roots is an interesting bit of trivia. The company's roots are in Texas, which is why the gecko is wearing a 10-gallon hat. It was started back in 1909 by Cleaves Rhea. In a complicated story it has had many names and owners. Read all about it in this issue. Who Knew?

Milwaukee County Genealogy Society, February 2014

There are many ethnic groups abound in this area of Wisconsin and you can find information about most of them in this quarterly. This issue has an article and picture of the Goethe House: the Milwaukee German Cultural center. It also has a nostalgic story about the Milwaukee Electric Railway and Light Company Streetcars, with memories from the 1950's.

Minnesota Genealogist, Fall 2013

This issue includes several excellent articles by members which make good reading even if you aren't related to any of these people. The methods and resources used should give new ideas.

Oklahoma Genealogy Society, September 2013.

The Jewish population of Oklahoma has been prominent in that state. An example is the story of Sylvan N Goldman who with his brother Alfred started a grocery business in Texas and later California. They then founded the first supermarket in Oklahoma and invented the shopping cart so customers could buy more at a time than using a basket. He also later contributed to the arts and other philanthropies as well as to the grocery business worldwide, all with only an 8th grade education.

The March 2014 issue contains a long article about the many bills in Congress and changes to access the Social Security Death Index (SSDI), a database many genealogists depend on. The rationale for the restrictions in access to the SSDI were to protect against fraud, identify theft, and federal budget savings. The bill restricting access to the SSDI for three years after a person dies was signed into law on December 26.

Whitman County Genealogy Society, February - March 2014

The editor shares a story told by her sister on her blog. It is about cookie making with a grandson. We all have family stories to share with our relatives and now is the time. Also included are stories of early pioneers in Whitman County Washington by Fred Yoder, Department of Sociology at Washington State College in Pullman 1936-37. These stories are based on interviews with pioneer family members and are priceless. If you didn't know, WSU has many sources available for this area.

Yakima Valley Genealogy Society, March 2014

This society has a huge genealogical library that is close enough for a day trip (be sure to check the website and call to ensure the library will be open when you plan to visit). Each issue of the Yakima Valley Genealogy Society Quarterly lists new books donated to it, including many from the Olympia Genealogy Society. There is also an article on Washington Agricultural College and School of Science Alumni: Pullman WA from the 1903 Chinook yearbook.

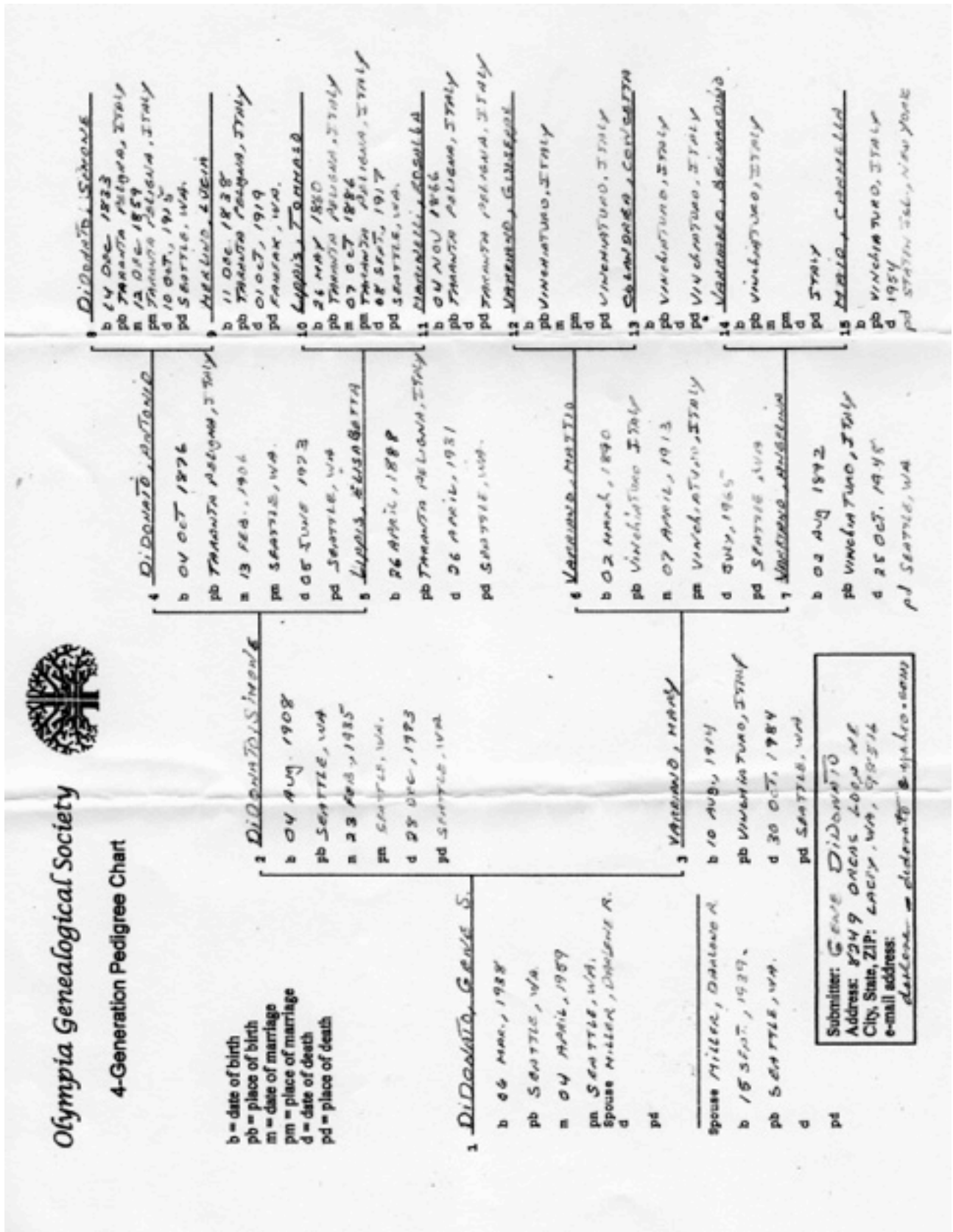
